

COVID-19 Testing in Rhode Island

COVID-19 testing is available at some local pharmacies, medical offices, and State-run test sites across Rhode Island. To find the location closest to you, visit covid.ri.gov/testing. Schedule an appointment for a free COVID-19 test at a State-run test site at portal.ri.gov or by calling **401-222-8022**.

Symptoms of COVID-19? Isolate at home and get tested.

If you or your child have symptoms, call your primary care provider or child's pediatrician. Ask if they do point-of-care testing or if they can schedule a test for you. Whether or not you're vaccinated, it is important that you isolate at home and get tested right away.

COVID-19 symptoms include:

- cough
- shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- fever or chills
- muscle or body aches
- sore throat
- headache
- nausea or vomiting
- diarrhea
- runny nose or stuffy nose
- fatigue
- recent loss of taste or smell

If you're not yet fully vaccinated, get tested every week. More information about how to protect your household and lower the chances of catching and spreading COVID-19 is available at covid.ri.gov/prevention.
